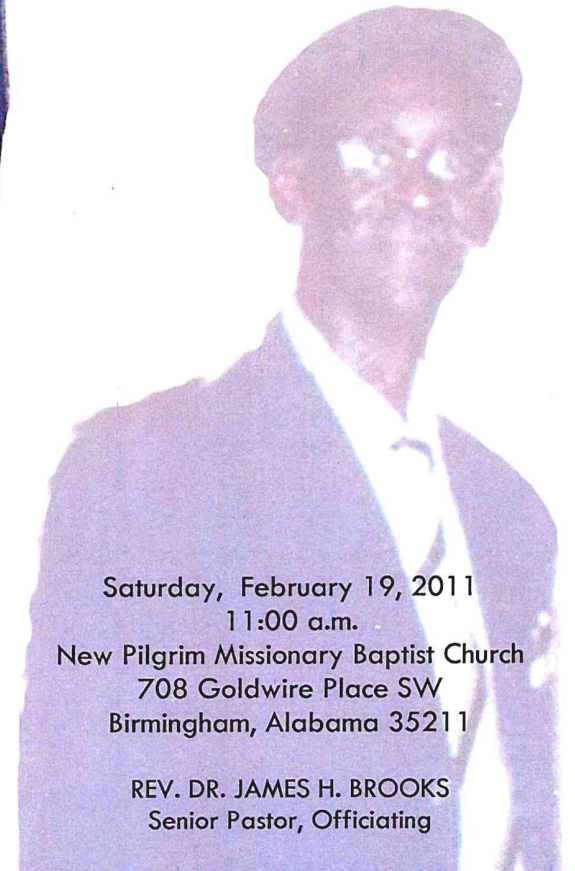

Celebration of Life
