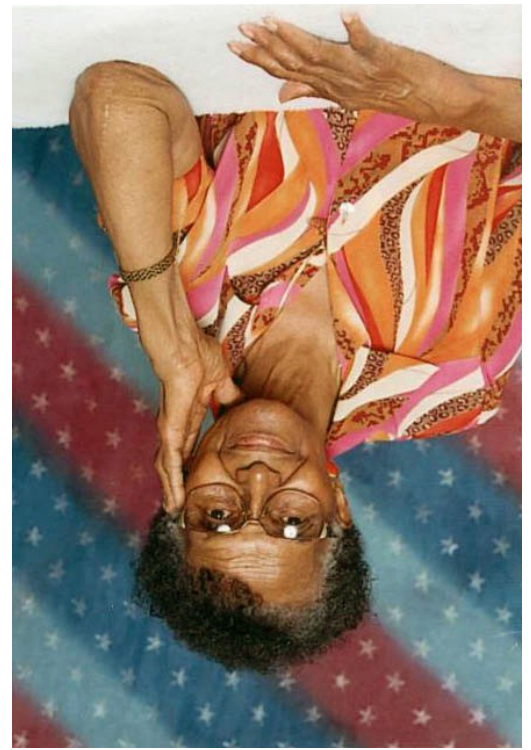

Without You

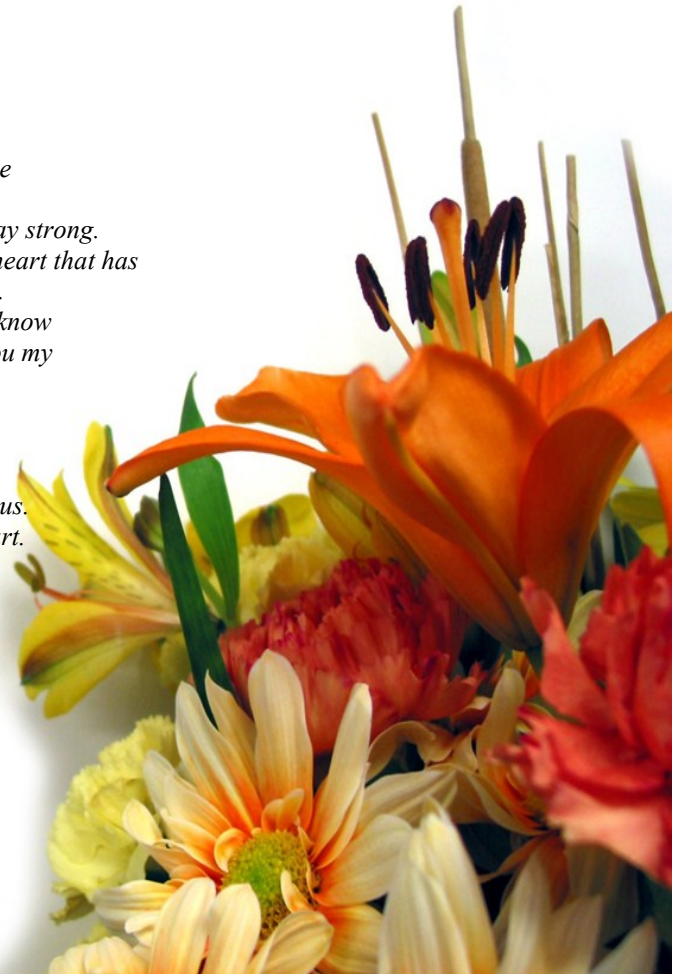
*“Granny,
